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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR & CEO

The Mississauga Foundation is celebrating another banner year! This year, our total assets surpassed \$31 Million and generated a 16.1% return on investment, with a five-year average return of 9.2%. As the

Foundation grows, so does our impact. **In 2024, the Foundation provided 185 grants valued at almost \$1.1 million in support of community building projects** and collectively, the Foundation has granted \$27.4 million since our inception in 2001.

Our impact is being noticed and is attracting new fundholders and supporters to the Foundation. Over the past two years, the Foundation has helped eleven charities to launch their own funds that generate undesignated grants to support their operations. In 2024, we welcomed the Mississauga Symphony Orchestra, Music for Every Child and Silent Voice as our newest Agency Fundholders. We were also pleased to welcome two additional Newcomer Funds; the Smita and Sisi Chakrabarti Fund for Newcomers and the Luis Miguel Aguirre Newcomer Fund and one new donor advised fund – the Elfstrom Family Fund.

When a donor creates a fund with the Foundation, they are embarking on a journey to create meaningful change in our city of Mississauga that will last in perpetuity. In this year's annual report, we are pleased to share two enduring funds that have had a profound impact on our community. The Winkworth Family Fund is an inspirational story of how one person's passion for homeless youth has turned into a multigenerational legacy of giving.

This year's report also highlights our partnership with the Mississauga Terriers Hockey Club and their Joe Schembri Scholarship Fund. Now in its twentieth year, this fund has provided financial assistance to more than twenty Terriers as they embarked on their post-secondary education. Thanks to support from the Pendle Fund, **the Mississauga Foundation is currently offering a limited matching donation program to help local sports clubs replicate this program for their athletes.**

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR & CEO

While 2024 was an exceptional year for the Foundation, we are acutely aware of the challenges of affordability and food insecurity facing our neighbours. In November of 2024, the City of Mississauga announced a Food Insecurity Emergency in our community. The Foundation instantly responded by donating \$10,000 to Food Banks Mississauga to support immediate relief and also established two permanent funds to address food insecurity in our city. The Mississauga Emergency Food Relief Fund which flows 100% of all donations directly to food programs in the city and the Mississauga Endowed Food Security Fund – which builds a long-term permanent endowment to address food insecurity in our community.

The Food Insecurity Emergency highlighted the Foundation’s need to build our community fund (Mississauga Fund) which is designated to respond to emerging needs, and emergencies in our community. The Foundation is looking forward to making an announcement in 2025 about our plans to grow the Mississauga Fund with a new matching donation program. Although there are multiple factors impacting the current financial and political environment, we remain optimistic about the year ahead.

SMART AND CARING CHILDREN AND YOUTH FUND

Empowering Youth with ADHD - Centre for ADHD Awareness, Canada (CADDAC)

The Mississauga Foundation is proud to have supported the Centre for ADHD Awareness, Canada (CADDAC) with a \$3,000 grant through the 2024 Smart and Caring Children and Youth Fund. This funding has helped initiate the Youth ADHD Group Coaching Program for individuals aged 16 to 24, covering essential early-stage promotion and coordination activities. Since January 2025, CADDAC has been actively promoting this new, low-barrier group coaching initiative, building anticipation within the Mississauga community. Awareness efforts, including participation at events such as the University of Toronto Mississauga's EmBody Fair, have highlighted the availability of vital mental health supports tailored to youth with ADHD.



This initiative directly supports CADDAC's mission to improve the lives of Canadians with ADHD through education, awareness, and advocacy. Guided by its vision of a Canada where individuals with ADHD are fully supported and understood, the organization is committed to equipping youth with the tools, strategies, and peer support necessary for personal and academic growth.

HAZEL MCCALLION FUND FOR ARTS, CULTURE & HERITAGE

Enhancing Accessibility and Awareness with QUIET PARADE - Blackwood Gallery

In 2024, the Mississauga Foundation awarded \$5,000 to the Blackwood Gallery for the QUIET PARADE event, a major celebration of disability culture in Mississauga. The Grant supported accessibility services, consultation fees, workshop facilitators, the printing of an accessibility guide, event supplies, and artist fees for the parade.

QUIET PARADE brought together artists, students, event partners, and residents, creating an impactful celebration of disability culture. With hundreds of attendees and dozens more participating in workshops, the event garnered significant attention, as reflected by UTM's social media metrics, which reported over 19,000 impressions and 900 engagements.



Over 25 volunteers also helped support the program, ensuring the event ran smoothly. The Blackwood Gallery's mission is to foster inclusivity and engagement with art that challenges social norms and supports diverse communities. The QUIET PARADE event not only advanced this mission but also highlighted the importance of making public spaces more accessible and inclusive.

NOVO NORDISK CHRONIC DISEASE FUND

Promoting Healthy Living for Older Adults - Social Planning Council of Peel (SPCP)

In 2024, the Mississauga Foundation awarded the Social Planning Council of Peel (SPCP) \$24,900 through the Novo Nordisk Chronic Disease Fund to support their initiative focused on promoting healthy eating and social wellness for older adults (55+). The funding enabled the delivery of seven in-person workshops, each lasting 1 to 2 hours, which were designed to teach practical skills related to healthy lifestyle choices and social engagement. The program had a profound impact on the community, benefiting seniors across Peel Region. A total of 94% of participants rated the workshops as excellent, very good, or good, reflecting the high level of engagement. Furthermore, 73% of attendees reported finding the workshops helpful, with 74% expressing a positive impression of the sessions.



The mission of the Social Planning Council of Peel is to enhance the quality of life for Peel residents by promoting social equity, inclusion, and community well-being. Their vision is to create a more connected, informed, and healthy community. This program aligns with their mission by addressing the specific health and wellness needs of seniors, empowering them with the knowledge and tools to improve their lifestyle.

PENDLE FUND

Printing New Possibilities: Advancing Inclusive Employment at Options Mississauga

The Mississauga Foundation awarded a \$25,000 grant through the 2024 Pendle Fund to Options Mississauga Print & Office Services. This funding was vital in supporting the purchase, setup, and start-up of a new print production machine—essential equipment that enables the organization to continue its print services while offering meaningful training and employment opportunities to individuals with intellectual disabilities. This grant directly impacted both the organization and the broader Mississauga community. The updated equipment, which includes improved technology and a more accessible interface, has enhanced the efficiency of services while supporting a more inclusive and hands-on learning environment for trainees and employees.



Options Mississauga Print & Office Services is deeply committed to empowering individuals through employment and training in a supportive, inclusive setting. Their mission is to enhance community engagement and foster independence through meaningful work experiences, while their vision is a world where all individuals, regardless of ability, can access opportunities to learn, grow, and succeed.

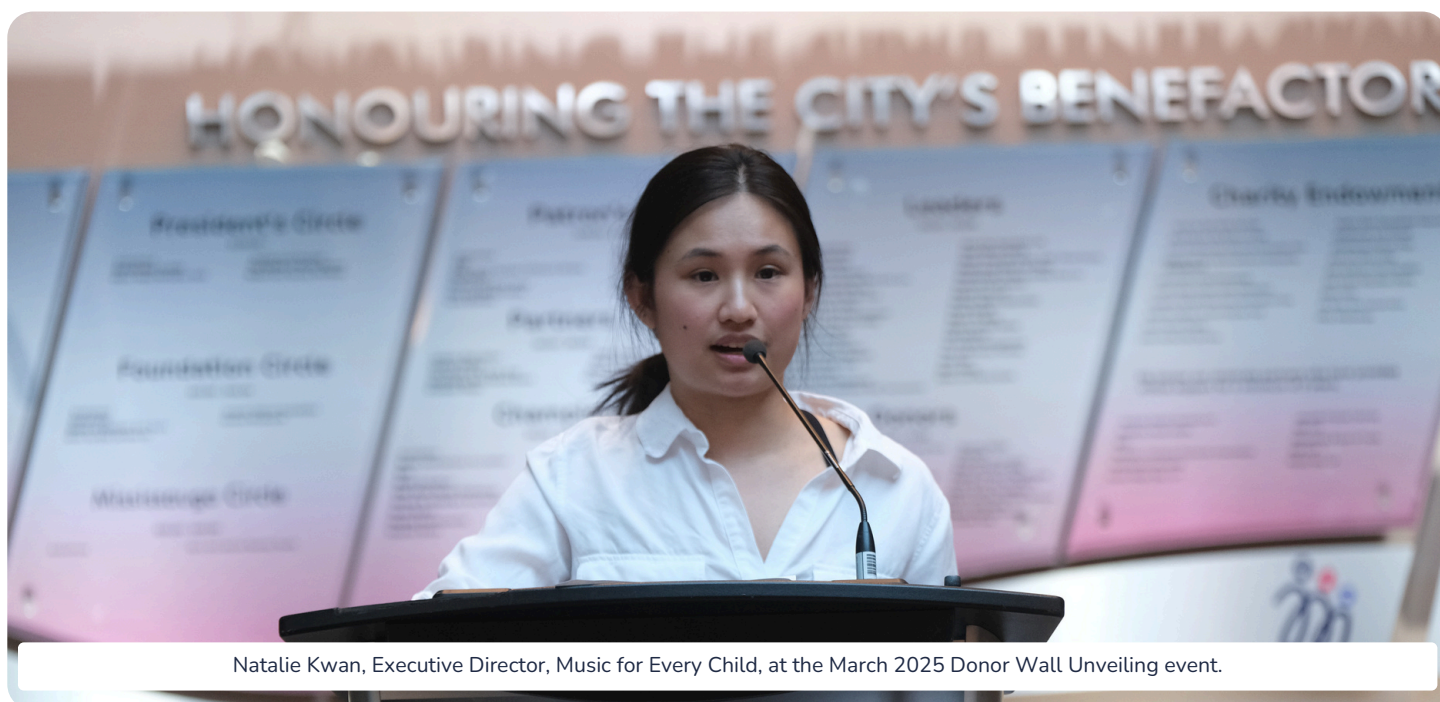

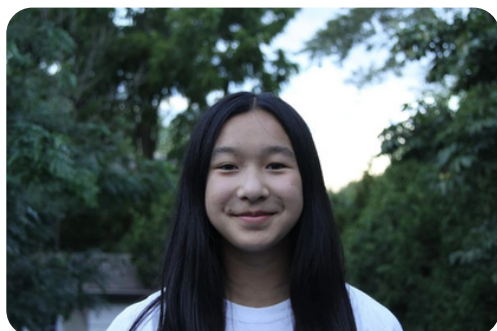

What is a Donor Advised Fund?

A donor-advised fund (DAF) at Mississauga Foundation allows donors to contribute assets, receive immediate tax benefits, and recommend grants to their chosen charities. It's a great alternative to creating a private foundation, offering the same impact without the administrative burden, legal complexities, and high costs associated with establishing and managing a private foundation. The foundation manages investments and administration, providing flexibility and professional support for long-term charitable giving.

Fundholder Spotlight - Winkworth Family Fund



The **Winkworth Family Fund** stands as a lasting symbol of compassion and commitment to homeless youth in Mississauga. Established through a bequest, the fund was created to ensure ongoing support for some of the community's most vulnerable—youth experiencing homelessness. Today, it continues to reflect the values and vision of its founder, JoAnne Winkworth.

JoAnne's connection to the Mississauga Foundation began in 2007 with a small but meaningful step: the creation of a fund aimed at helping homeless youth. What started as a personal act of giving soon grew into a deep, long-term partnership with the Foundation. JoAnne became an active member of the community, attending events, learning about emerging local needs, and thoughtfully growing her fund year after year.

Her commitment didn't stop there. JoAnne included the Foundation in her estate plans, ensuring that her work would live on through the Winkworth Family Fund. Her foresight and generosity allow the fund to continue supporting youth in need, long after her passing.

In recognition of her extraordinary impact, JoAnne was posthumously **awarded the Pendle Award for Philanthropy in 2021**. The award honored her unwavering dedication to community wellbeing and her enduring legacy of kindness and action.

The Winkworth Family Fund is more than a source of support—it is a tribute to one woman's lifelong dedication to making a difference. JoAnne's story reminds us that when giving is guided by purpose, it can create ripples of change for generations to come.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Fundholder Spotlight - The Joe Schembri Scholarship Fund



For two decades, the **Joe Schembri Scholarship Fund** has been making a lasting impact in Mississauga by supporting young athletes in their pursuit of education. Established through an initial donation—matched by the **Mississauga Terriers Hockey Club**—the fund has grown steadily through careful investment. What’s compelling is that the Mississauga Terriers donated \$40,000 to establish the fund, and to date, it has generated more than that amount in scholarships, **distributing over \$40,000 to support student-athletes.**

“The Mississauga Terriers Hockey Club has always been a community based organization with a philosophy of “Do it for the Kids” and a mission of “Molding our Future, One Player at a Time”. The establishment of The Joe Schembri Scholarship Fund created the opportunity for the club to invest in future generations by supporting student-athletes as they pursue their personal educational goals and at the same time honouring a legacy of dedication to youth hockey in our community.”

The Joe Schembri Scholarship Fund is just one of several ways local donors are making education more accessible in Mississauga. Another remarkable example is the **Nancy Salmon Scholarship Fund**, which began granting in 2014. Since then, it has provided financial assistance to 785 students at the University of Toronto Mississauga, awarding a total of \$498,356. Since its inception, the fund has grown over \$1.9 million and will continue to support students in need—in perpetuity.

What is a Field of Interest Fund?

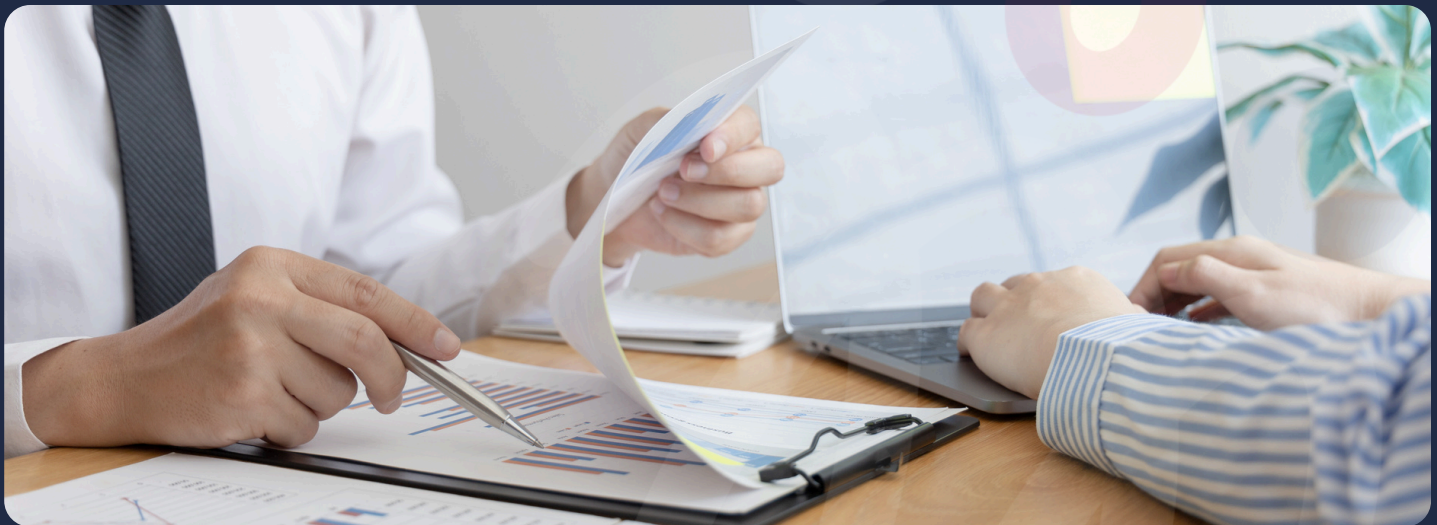
