As the Mississauga Foundation wraps up another busy year, we are already looking forward to **celebrating 25 years of community service and impact in 2026**. Coinciding with our 25th anniversary,

the Foundation will be updating our strategic plan, exploring Impact Investing in our community and making some exciting funding announcements as we continue on our path to double our impact by 2031.

In our last annual report, the Foundation highlighted the need to address Affordability, Housing, Food Security and Public Safety in our community and that has guided our work in 2025. During fiscal 2025, **the Foundation launched two new scholarship programs with JUMP Basketball and the Ontario Schools Cricket Association**, making post-secondary education more affordable for families in Mississauga. The Marsella Family Fund was established to support food insecurity in our community, and three new Mississauga Funds were created – The Padfield Mushynski Family Fund, The Jauernig Family Fund and the Tara Addis Mississauga Vitality Fund. Mississauga Funds are undesignated funds and granting from these funds can be directed to the most pressing needs in our community. As such, the Foundation is pleased to provide matching donations when a donor creates a Mississauga Fund.

In our efforts to create long-term sustainable operating funds to help local charities, the Foundation also provided matching donations to Options Mississauga and Safe City Mississauga to help them establish endowed operating funds.

Our work in the community is fueled by our endowment pool and as of December 31, 2025 our **assets surpassed \$34.7 million** and generated an **11.3% return on investments**. This allowed the Foundation to make **199 grants valued at over \$1.2 million** in support of community building projects and collectively, the Foundation has now **granted more than \$28.8 million since our inception in 2001**.

We know that there is much more that needs to be done to support the growing needs in our community and as we begin the implementation of our new strategic plan in 2027, our focus will be on growing our endowed funds, supporting local charities with operating funds and exploring opportunities to make direct investments in our community.

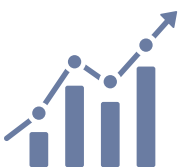

SMART AND CARING CHILDREN AND YOUTH FUND

Supporting Healthy Starts for Mississauga's Youngest Residents - Breakfast with Santa Foundation

The Mississauga Foundation was proud to award \$2,994.50 through the Smart and Caring Children & Youth grant stream in 2025 to the Breakfast With Santa Foundation for its Diapers 4 Kids initiative. This funding supported the purchase and distribution of essential infant care items, including diapers in multiple sizes, pull-ups, and diaper rash cream, to families experiencing financial hardship across Mississauga. The grant helped address a basic but critical need for families with young children. By easing the financial burden of purchasing diapers and related supplies, the initiative improved daily comfort, hygiene, and overall health outcomes for approximately 180 children.



The program reached families across several neighbourhoods and extended its impact through partnerships with local organizations such as Vita Centre and Armagh House. The availability of these essential items also reduced stress for caregivers, allowing them to focus on other aspects of their children's well-being. As one partner organization shared, *"Your support encourages us to remain committed to reaching our goal of helping vulnerable families in our community."* This response reflects the lasting value of the program and its role in strengthening a network of care for Mississauga's youngest residents.

HAZEL MCCALLION FUND FOR ARTS, CULTURE & HERITAGE

Growing Community Connection Through Accessible Summer Chamber Music - The Chamber Music Society of Mississauga Inc.

The Mississauga Foundation was proud to award \$10,000 through the Hazel McCallion Fund for Arts, Culture and Heritage in 2025 to The Chamber Music Society of Mississauga Inc. to support its summer concert series at the Riverwood Conservancy. The funding was used to support artist fees for 28 musicians across eight weekly outdoor performances, helping ensure high-quality live music remained free and accessible to the public. The concert series had a significant impact on community engagement with the arts, drawing consistently strong audiences throughout the summer. Each weekly performance attracted approximately 250 attendees, with events reaching full capacity and parking lots often filled to overflow.



The initiative has grown steadily over eight years, evolving from a small series of three concerts into a full eight-week summer program with a loyal and expanding audience. This sustained growth highlights the series' importance as a much-anticipated seasonal offering that continues to strengthen community connection through shared musical experiences in Mississauga. Through accessible programming and collaboration with local artists, the organization works to make classical and chamber music welcoming and engaging for diverse audiences.

Over \$162,000 granted from the Novo Nordisk Chronic Disease Fund



NOVO NORDISK CHRONIC DISEASE FUND

Strengthening Chronic Disease Prevention Through Education, Movement, and Community Support - MIAG Centre for Diverse Women & Families

The Mississauga Foundation was proud to award \$25,000 through the Novo Nordisk Chronic Disease Fund in 2025 to MIAG Centre for Diverse Women & Families to support a comprehensive chronic disease prevention program. The program had a significant impact on community health outcomes by increasing knowledge, awareness, and healthy behaviour among participants. A total of 20 workshops were delivered, reaching 271 individuals with 1,252 total attendances. Evaluation results demonstrated substantial improvements across multiple health indicators, including an increase in disease knowledge from 92% of participants, physical activity levels rising from 34% to 86%, resource awareness increasing from 15% to 87%, and nutrition and activity understanding improving from 30% to 97%.



As a newly launched initiative, early results indicate strong potential for long-term impact, with participants reporting sustained improvements in health knowledge and lifestyle habits, as well as sharing information with family and community members, extending the program's reach beyond direct participants.

Over \$447,000 granted from the Pendle Fund



PENDLE FUND

Enhancing Public Safety and Rapid Response at Community Events Across Mississauga - St. John Ambulance Peel-Dufferin

The Mississauga Foundation was proud to award \$6,620 through the Pendle Fund in 2025 to St. John Ambulance Peel-Dufferin to strengthen its community-based first aid and emergency response services. The funding supported the purchase of three new first aid tents and standard-compliant uniforms for medical first responders operating on bicycles, and its impact was reflected in improved safety and responsiveness at large-scale community gatherings. The addition of clearly marked first aid stations enhanced the organization's ability to deliver immediate care in high-traffic environments, while high-visibility uniforms made it easier for individuals in distress to quickly identify and reach responders. Together, these improvements strengthened public confidence and ensured that medical support was more readily available in crowded and fast-paced event settings.



Volunteers expressed appreciation for being better equipped, noting that the new resources contributed to higher morale and confidence in their ability to serve the public. These enhancements ensure the organization is well prepared to continue supporting major Mississauga events, including those at Celebration Square and Port Credit Memorial Park, throughout the year.

Fundholder Spotlight - Embrace Agency to End Violence

For more than 30 years, Embrace Agency to End Violence has been a place of safety, hope, and healing for survivors of gender-based violence across the Region of Peel. Behind every crisis call answered, every counselling session provided, and every shelter bed prepared is a person taking the first courageous step toward rebuilding their life.

Embrace supports women, Two-Spirit, genderqueer, trans, and non-binary individuals and their children who are experiencing violence, offering not only emergency shelter and advocacy, but also compassion, dignity, and the reassurance that they are not alone.

Since 1981, Embrace has supported more than 51,000 survivors and their families. In the past year alone, the organization safely sheltered 136 survivors and 74 children, responded to 543 crisis calls, and provided counselling and support to 837 individuals in the community.



“Meaningful transformation in the lives of survivors requires more than a single moment of intervention; it requires a community committed to sustained care and long-term support. The partnership between Embrace Agency to End Violence and the Mississauga Foundation serves as a vital source of hope and stability for families across the Peel Region. As we work toward expanding our bed capacity to 82 and modernizing our

trauma-informed facilities, this collaboration is helping us build more than just shelter—it is creating a lasting foundation of safety, dignity, and healing for a future free from violence.”

What is a Donor Advised Fund?

A donor-advised fund (DAF) at Mississauga Foundation allows donors to contribute assets, receive immediate tax benefits, and recommend grants to their chosen charities. It's a great alternative to creating a private foundation, offering the same impact without the administrative burden, legal complexities, and high costs associated with establishing and managing a private foundation. The foundation manages investments and administration, providing flexibility and professional support for long-term charitable giving.

Fundholder Spotlight - Elfstrom Family Fund

Some decisions are made not only for today, but for the years and generations that follow. When Carol Elfstrom established the Elfstrom Family Fund, she was thinking beyond a single gift. She wanted to create something lasting—an opportunity for her family to continue supporting the causes and communities that matter to them long into the future.

"I chose to establish this fund after my husband of 52 years passed away. He was an exceptionally generous person who was always willing to help others—whether by offering his time to mentor those who needed guidance or by providing financial assistance during difficult times. I learned the value of generosity from my mother, who gave what she could to those in need, even though our family did not have much to spare.

Through this fund, I wanted to create a meaningful and lasting way for my children and future generations to support their own communities.

I chose to establish the fund with the Mississauga Foundation rather than creating a private family foundation because it offers a much simpler and more efficient way to manage charitable giving. The stock transfer process involved a number of administrative steps related to the way the shares were held. Shares held through a brokerage are generally more straightforward to transfer. In my case, the shares were transferred to me as part of my mother's estate and were held with Computershare.

Working with the foundation, there is no need to spend time or resources on accounting or tax filings, as the Foundation oversees these administrative responsibilities. Instead, you can focus on selecting the organizations you wish to support. Glenn and the entire team at the Foundation have been highly responsive, supportive, and a pleasure to work with."

For Rishi Oberoi, basketball has always been about more than the game. As the co-founder of JUMP Basketball, his vision has consistently focused on building strong, confident young people—both on and off the court. Now, through the JUMP Basketball Scholarship Fund at the Mississauga Foundation, that vision is extending even further.

“Our motto at Jump Basketball is BALL Today, LEAD Tomorrow,” says Oberoi. “The idea behind that was that players in our program learn basketball and develop real-life skills like resilience, teamwork, communication, and leadership.”

That philosophy has guided the organization’s work with youth across Mississauga. But as participants began to graduate from the program, Oberoi saw an opportunity to deepen that impact.



“The fund at Mississauga Foundation allowed us to take that principle a step further by supporting their education goals after they graduate from our program.”

By easing financial barriers, the fund ensures that the same young people who developed leadership skills through sport can continue to grow and succeed academically.

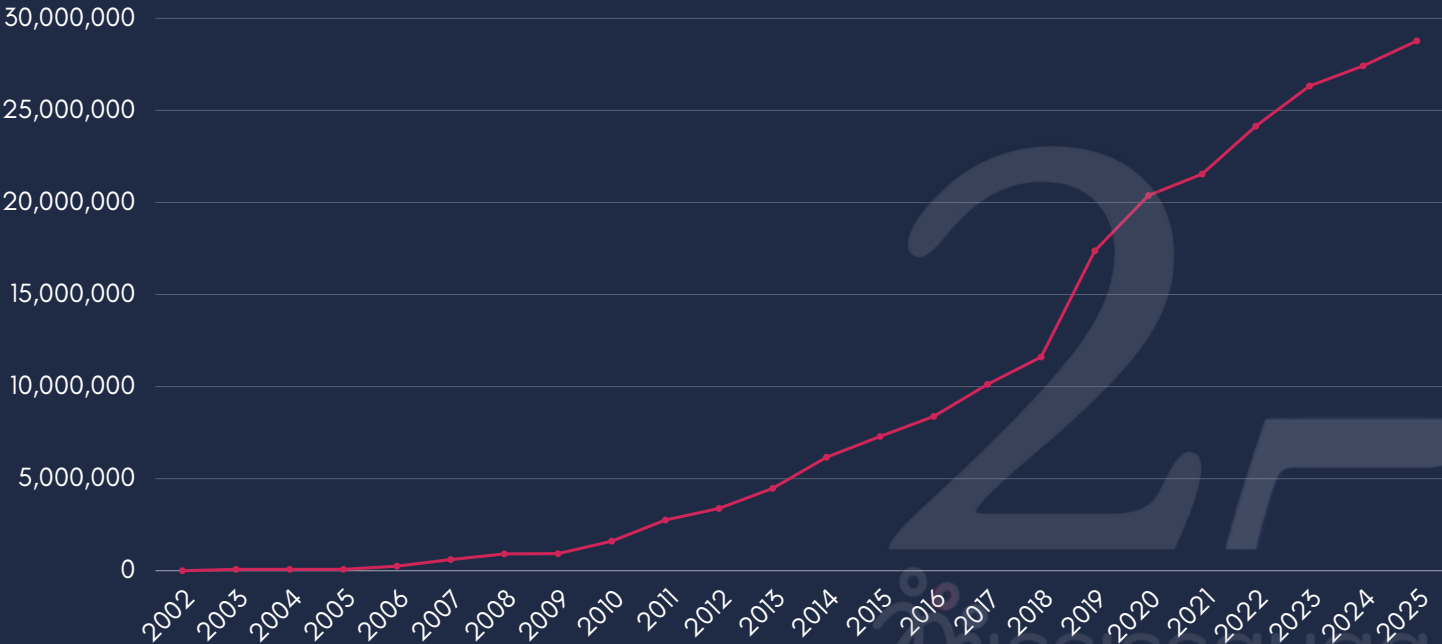
